The March publication also contained an additional leaflet providing scams advice, which unfortunately is becoming an ever increasing problem. This leaflet was funded by the National Neighbourhood Watch Network Community Grant Fund.

Scam Alerts from Which? and Croydon Council

Croydon Borough Neighbourhood Watch regularly receives updates from Which? providing up to date information on scams that are doing the rounds. Which? Consumer magazine has issued a warning about the latest scam which uses Royal Mail to lure people in by using a phishing email. Extract from the article:

"The fake Royal Mail chatbot is plausible – it lists a delivery tracking number and shares an image of a parcel explaining that the 'label was damaged' to convince you to reschedule the delivery. Clicking the link takes you to a different website, asking for your name, address, and payment details. The small print at the very top of this page – which is only visible when you scroll up on a mobile phone – reveals that adding these details enters you into a 'Skill Game' and purchases a three-day trial to bilingua.net costing £2 then £59 every 30 days. A few days later, we noticed that this form switched to promoting a different website – called proplanner.io – costing £62 every 30 days."

Scam Alerts from Which? and Croydon Council

Croydon Borough Trading Standards also have the following advice in regards these types of scams:

"Please be very careful when receiving emails and texts from couriers or Royal Mail and if you think you have a parcel due do not click any link – go direct to the actual business website and check the tracking number yourself."



More generally Croydon Council Trading Standards also state:

"If you are suspicious about an email you have received, forward it to report@phishing.gov.uk. The content of Suspicious text messages should be forward to the number 7726 which is free of charge.



Please remember to report to Action Fraud 0300 123 2040 if you have actually been the victim of a scam or call Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline 0808 223 1133 if you require further advice."

Celebrating 40 years of National Neighbourhood Watch

This year the National Neighbourhood Watch celebrates its 40th Birthday. Many people have some understanding of what Neighbourhood Watch does but how many know how it came into exsistance?

Neighbourhood watch can trace its roots back to 1960's USA.

In 1964, 28-year-old Kitty Genovese was stabbed in New York outside the apartment building across the street from where she lived.

Two weeks after the murder it was rumoured that 38 witnesses saw or heard the attack, but none of them called the police or came to her aid. This motivated a community response and the very first Neighbourhood Watch scheme was set up.

In 1982 the first scheme in the UK, known as Home Watch, was set up in Mollington, Cheshire. Neighbourhood Watch representatives formed local, county and regional groups. In 2007, with the support of the police and the Home Office, the first national umbrella organisation (Neighbourhood and Home Watch) for the movement was established. In 2017 the present Neighbourhood Watch Network was established as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), regulated by The Charity Commission, to replace Neighbourhood & Home Watch Network. Croydon Borough Neighbourhood Watch Association with its 335 coordinators and approximately 1000 subscribers to its website is an integral part of this organisation.
