
CROYDON NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH UPDATE

Croydon Borough Police Updates

As one would expect, Croydon Safer Neighbourhood's Teams have been busy over the last few months targeting criminals and those individuals involved in anti-social behaviour.

Purley and Woodcote SNT have been dealing with a variety of issues over the last month or so. A male was arrested and two Akita dogs were seized for being dangerously out of control. Another male was sectioned under section 136 of the Mental Health Act as he was becoming a danger to himself and others near Purley Tesco.

Officers from Old Coulsdon SNT dealt with an individual who was flaunting a knife inside their house in a threatening manner to family, the individual was



detained by the team and subsequently arrested for Domestic affray and being wanted for failing to appear on a Crown court warrant.

Officers in the north of the borough have been equally active over the last month of so. Based on information from members of the public weapon sweeps uncovered and confiscated knives, an axe, a sword and even a crossbow. Weapon sweeps are conducted in public areas to look for weapons



that have been hidden by individuals for criminal intentions. Thornton Heath SNT executed a Dangerous Dogs warrant at an address in the Bensham Manor ward to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the dogs and local residents. Four dogs were removed from the address and are now being looked after and assessed at Police kennels.

Scams & Fraud

Action Fraud received over 750 reports in four days relating to fake emails purporting to be from Ofgem. The emails state that the recipient is eligible for a rebate as a result of a newly announced government scheme. The links in the emails lead to genuine-looking websites that are designed to steal your personal and financial information.

• Remember, your bank, or any other official organisation, won't ask you to share personal information over email or text. If you need to check that it's a genuine message, contact the company using details from their official website or app.

Scam Alerts

Delivery Scam

There are lots of different types of scams, and people can be targeted in many ways - whether that's by phone, email, mail or even in person. One type of scam is a delivery text/email scam. These can be text messages or phishing emails pretending to be from a delivery courier like DPD or Royal Mail. These messages claim that you have missed a delivery and ask you to reschedule for a fee, thereby obtaining your bank details. Whilst it can start with a small fee, it can end with criminals emptying a person's entire bank account.

You can take precautions by following the advice below:

- Don't click on links in text messages or emails.

- Ignore the message and contact the business directly.

- You should report the text and can alert the

network operator by sending the text to the number 7726.

- If you have clicked on any links and lost money, contact your bank immediately.

Scams Reported by our co-ordinators

Several of our co-ordinators have been in touch to report a potential scam involving replacing copper wire with fibre cable. A man knocked at the door and explained that the fibre cable would be much faster. His details could not be verified and he had no paperwork but he did show the residents an ID badge.

Please be vigilant when answering the door to cold callers and please verify any ID presented by calling the organisation independently (DO NOT use a number presented by the cold caller).
