Update on Neighbourhood Policing in Croydon

The Met have named the strengthening of neighbourhood policing as a core priority within "The Turnaround Plan". They appreciate the value that community policing brings to the Met. As a result they intend to strengthen





neighbourhood teams so they can better engage with the public and understand their concerns. The Met intend to increase Police Officer numbers supported by additional Police Community Support Officers. Croydon Neighbourhood Watch is delighted with this refocusing on community policing and will continue to work in partnership with these teams.

In the meantime the Safer Neigbourhood Teams (SNTs) have been doing some fantastic work tackling crime and anti-social behaviour in the borough. Sanderstead SNT assisted in developing and then executing a section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act search warrant. Officers entered a property and found class A & B drugs along with an imitation firearm. Two males were arrested for possession with intent to supply drugs.



SNT's have also been doing their bit to keep our roads safe. Purley and Woodcote SNT have recently made arrests for both drink driving and driving under the influence of drugs. Sanderstead SNT have been tackling speeding by initiating a number of speeding operations where they have been identifying, stopping and educating drivers about the dangers of speeding.

Finally, both Kenley and Sanderstead teams have also disrupted cannabis factories in their respective wards. Officers were called to reports of a burglary in Sanderstead only to uncover a cannabis factory with around 300 cannabis plants! Kenley officers identified a factory with 160 plants and arrested an individual as they tried to leave the factory.




Support Croydon Neighbourhood Watch AND Win up to £25,000 with the Croydon Community Lottery




